Recently, i was lamenting to a Jewish friend that the entire world of the church had changed, and it felt strange. He quickly reminded me that, throughout our history, Christians have evolved and adapted to the time. The early church had to find new ways to worship outside of Jerusalem. The church also had to find new languages for prayer as it moved into new places. Congregations had to develop new structures of leadership as the church became more formalized. And through wars, famines, disease outbreaks, the rise of literacy, and even the discovery of new continents, the church adapted. Our architecture changed, our modes of being changed.

Change is, in fact, the one thing that Jesus promised us. Throughout his ministry and his teaching, he advises us that we need to listen and understand because he is going on ahead of us. How ae we listening and understanding now?

I almost can't count the number of changes we have done since early March. We now gather on video and phone. We've mastered some of that technology and become mentors for our peers. 

### HELP THE TENANTS DISPLACED BY THE FIRE:

At the end of April, the Four Seasons Chinese restaurant in Honeoye Falls, suffered a major fire. The restaurant is a complete loss. The families that live above lost their homes. Here are ways you can help our neighbors in need at this time.

- 1. If you would like to donate towards that gift, please send a check to the office with the words "Fire Assistance" in the memo line.
- 2. A local organization called the Kade Project is collecting furniture for the families who were displaced: end tables, chairs, a small dresser, loveseat (or same size couch), a medium-sized bookshelf, a small cupboard (for canned goods), cabinet table, 2 tall stools and gift-cards to Wal-Mart or Target.
- 3. There is a GoFundMe account for the Yang family, the owners of Four Seasons Restaurant. The fund will be used to help them restart their business. A link can be found in the almost daily emails!


#### **DID YOU HEAR THAT?!**

#### SUMMARY OF THE SALE OF THE RAND HOUSE

In April we completed the sale of the Rand House, the rectory that we owned since 1876. It was quite an adventure to sell the property, involving various levels of Diocesan and Court review, as well as re-routing of utilities and a number of projects to research titles, deeds, and property lines. In total, staff, Vestry and our various consultants spent hundreds of hours to complete the sale. We welcome our new neighbors, Joel and Kelly Kreider. Once we are able to gather again in person, we will hold a party to welcome them.

In the meantime, here is an accounting of the sale:

Total proceeds: \$121,000

#### Expenses:

Relocation of the utilities:	\$21,300
Legal	\$ 6,384
Engineering	\$ 1,470
Appraisal	\$ 500
Permits	\$ 500
Repairs	<u>\$ 458</u>
Total Expenses	\$30, 612

Net proceeds: \$90,388

The proceeds were deposited into our operating account, and will be transferred to our endowment. Thank you to the various firms with which we worked to complete this transaction, including Trevett Christo attorneys, the Village of Honeoye Falls, the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester, McMahon LaRue Engineers, AP Plumbing, and James Heath.
