
Relecting on the State of St. John

Rector's Report January 31, 2021

The Early Days

- Founded in 1840, the original church building was dedicated in 1842. The campus consisted of the church, the land immediately to the right of the church, and Episcopal Avenue. It was known as "The Church in the Trees."
- The Carriage House was built soon after as a barn for church goers to store their buggies
- A long series of clergy through the 19th century, none serving more than 5 years,.
- The rectory was deeded to St. John's in 1876.
- The original square church was significantly remodeled and a half-round apse was added in the late 1870's. This was to reflect liturgical change going on in England.
- The Parish House was built in the backyard of the rectory in the 1930's.
- Two additional parcels were added in the early 1960's, and the houses were razed to create the parking lot.



The Late 1940's

- St. John's is in a bit of decline.
- Helen Cooney (former historian of St. John's) writes that upon her arrival:
 - The congregation consisted of 3 people
 - The only service offered was Evening Prayer on Sunday nights
 - Including the sermon, the service lasted a mere half hour.
 - The rector, a Fr. Dennis, had given the rectory to friends to occupy
 - He had turned the Carriage House into a bit of "night club" and liked to have card parties in there.

Recovery and Expansion

- The parish recovered, and by the last 70's was on the forefront of changes in the church
 - Women began to serve on the Vestry
 - The parish called its first woman priest in 1982.
 - The Episcopal Church officially approved the ordination of women in 1977.
